tānsi ka-ati-tohta maskīkiy ohci kīwētīn-sākastēnohk (Northeast Saskatchewan Vaccine Plan)

- Moderna maskīkiy mēkwac āhpatān itēkē kīwētīn-sākastēnohk kisiskāciwan poko itē kaki-astēw mīna poko-isi kaki-pimōtatāniwan namōya kisāstaw Pfizer/BioNTech maskīkiya (The Moderna vaccine being used in Northern Saskatchewan is more flexible in that it can be stored and transported at temperatures not as low as required for the Pfizer/BioNTech vaccine).
- ōhi nīso maskīkiya kwayask kī-kocihtāniwana; mōya anihi nānitaw ka-itohtākowāw mīya miyopaniwa; poko itē askihk āhptana ōta kānata (Both vaccines have been rigorously tested; are **SAFE** and highly effective; and have been approved by many countries for use including Canada).
- mōya mistahi maskīkiy astēw mēkwac, nīkan aniki ka-atoskēcik ēkwa ka-wīkicik maskīkiwīkamikohk; omaskīkinīniwak kā-nākacyācīk aniki mēkwac ka-āhkosicik; ēkwa kētēyak (Given the limited amount of vaccine that is available in the initial phase, vaccinations are starting with staff and residents of long term care; health care workers providing direct-care to COVID-19 patients; and the those over the age of 50, starting with the oldest).
- mōya takīkac ka-otinaman maskīkiy kīspin mōna ki-nohtē-otinēn (Vaccination for COVID-19 is voluntary).
- nīso poko ka-otinaman Moderna maskīkiy, māka poko nīsomitanāw-ayinānēwosap kīsikaki ka-pēwan mām wēs kīhtwan pēyako ē-otinamani (The Moderna vaccine is administered in two doses, 28 days apart).
